



The City of Angleton water system PWS ID 0200002 has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to properly disinfect water before distribution, maintain acceptable disinfection residuals within the distribution system, monitor the disinfectant residual at various locations throughout the distribution system and report the results of that monitoring to the TCEQ on a quarterly basis.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from microbial contamination.

This violation involves the late submittal of a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report that occurred in the first quarter of the 2015 monitoring period.

Although the submittal of the Disinfection Level Quarterly Report was not done in a timely fashion, the required samples were taken and the disinfection levels were identified. The disinfection levels at all sampling locations during the first quarter of 2015 were in compliance with TCEQ standards. Moving forward, the City of Angleton has made adjustments to personnel and additional training will be provided to help ensure no future violations occur.
