THE FOLLOWING REPRESENTS THE ACTIONS TAKEN BY THE ANGLETON CITY COUNCIL IN THE ORDER THEY OCCURRED DURING THE MEETING. THE CITY COUNCIL OF ANGLETON, TEXAS CONVENED IN A REGULAR MEETING ON TUESDAY, MAY 26, 2020, AT 6:00 P.M., IN THE ANGLETON CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS, 120 S. CHENANGO, ANGLETON, TEXAS.

DECLARATION OF A QUORUM AND CALL TO ORDER

With a quorum present, Mayor Perez called the Council Meeting to order at 6:22 P.M., Mayor Perez, Mayor pro-tem Wright, Council Member Booth, Council Member Marin, Council Member Svoboda, and Council Member Vasut were present.

Municipal Judge Jeffrey Gilbert led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Member Vasut led the invocation.

2. Administer Oath of Office for Council Member, Position 1 – Mikey Svoboda by Judge Jeffrey Gilbert
The Oath of Office was administered by Judge Jeffrey Gilbert. Council Member Mikey Svoboda took his seat at the dais.

3. Administer Oath of Office for Council Member, Position 3 – John Wright by Judge Jeffrey Gilbert
The Oath of Office was administered by Judge Jeffrey Gilbert. Council Member John Wright took his seat at the dais.

4. Administer Oath of Office for Council Member, Position 5 – Mark Gongora by Judge Jeffrey Gilbert
The Oath of Office was administered by Judge Jeffrey Gilbert. Council Member Mark Gongora took his seat at the dais.

PUBLIC HEARING

5. Conduct a public hearing on the disannexation petition submitted on May 6, 2020, to disannex 3.84 acres near Henderson Road as a condition of the development agreement with Concourse Development.
Upon a motion by Mayor pro-tem Wright and seconded by Council Member Booth, Council opened the public hearing. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

The public hearing was conducted and upon a motion by Mayor pro-tem Wright and seconded by Council Member Booth, Council closed the public hearing. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

REGULAR AGENDA

6. Discussion and possible action on Ordinance No. 20200526-006 disannexing and excluding property from the corporate limits of the City, providing a severability clause; and providing for repeal and effective date.
Upon a motion by Mayor pro-tem Wright and seconded by Council Member Booth, Council approved Ordinance No. 20200526-006. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

7. Discussion and possible action on Ordinance No. 20200526-007 amending Ordinance 832 to consent to the acquisition of road powers and the issuance of bonds for road facilities and recreational facilities by Rancho Isabella Municipal Utility District.
Upon a motion by Council Member Booth and seconded by Mayor pro-tem Wright, Council approved Ordinance No. 20200526-007. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

8. Discussion and possible action on the election of Mayor pro-tem to serve as one-year term.

Upon a motion by Council Member Svoboda and seconded by Council Member Gongora, Council appointed Council Member Wright as Mayor pro-tem. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

9. Discussion and possible action on Governor Abbott executive orders to date and Brazoria County emergency declarations and impact on the City of Angleton and how to proceed with city business in the future.

Council directed staff to open the playgrounds with signage, sanitation, and hand washing stations immediately and open the pool with 20% occupancy by June 15, 2020.

Upon a motion by Mayor pro-tem Wright and seconded by Council Member Gongora, Council approved the following hotel occupancy tax deadline schedule:

2020 Quarter 1	Due September 1, 2021
2020 Quarter 2	Due October 2020
2020 Quarter 3	Due January 2020
2020 Quarter 4	Due April 2021
2021 Quarter 1	Due July 2021
2021 Quarter 2	Payment is as regularly scheduled

The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

Upon a motion by Council Member Booth and seconded by Mayor pro-tem Wright, Council waived utility late or disconnect fees for May 2020. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

10. Discussion and possible action on basic internet and broadband service in the City of Angleton.

This item was postponed.

11. Discussion and possible action on choosing a vendor for AMI meter implementation project.

Upon a motion by Council Member Booth and seconded by Council Member Svoboda, Council approved Sensus USA, Inc. as the vendor for AMI meter implementation project. The motion passed on a 5-0 vote. Mayor pro-tem Wright abstained.

12. Discussion and possible action on Enterprise Fleet Management.

No action taken.

13. Discussion and possible action to adopt a homestead exemption.

Upon a motion by Mayor pro-tem Wright and seconded by Council Member Booth, Council adopted a 1% homestead exemption for 2020 taxes. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

14. Discussion and possible action to approve the financial statements for March 2020 and midyear update.
No action taken.
15. Discussion and possible action on Ordinance No. 20200526-015 amending the 2019-2020 fiscal year budget to include the general fund, the street fund, the water fund, and miscellaneous minor funds; declaring a public necessity; providing a severability clause; providing an open meetings clause and an effective date.
Upon a motion by Council Member Booth and seconded by Mayor pro-tem Wright, Council approved Ordinance No. 20200526-015. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.
16. Discussion and possible action on selecting the electrical provider for the City of Angleton.
Upon a motion by Mayor pro-tem Wright and seconded by Council Member Svoboda, Council authorized the City Manager to select and execute an agreement with an electrical provider up to 10 years. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.
17. Discussion and possible action on Ordinance No. 20200526-017 amending Chapter 27 Vehicles for Hire and repealing Article iii. Wreckers and replacing it with Article iii. Vehicle Towing of the City of Angleton Code of Ordinances; providing a severability clause; providing for a penalty; and providing for repeal and effective date.

18. Discussion and possible action to approve the purchase of modems for patrol vehicles.
Upon a motion by Mayor pro-tem Wright and seconded by Council Member Gongora, Council approved the purchase 9 units from the capital fund. The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.
