

## City of Angleton to conduct a Water Service Line Inventory required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ)

To meet the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed Lead and Copper Rule Revisions requirements, the City of Angleton and all community water systems must conduct, submit, and certify a Water Service Line Inventory to the TCEQ by October 16, 2024. The EPA's goal is to make rapid progress on permanently removing a significant source of lead in drinking water and achieving major improvements in public health. Therefore, the EPA has dedicated \$15 billion in funding through the 2021 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to replace affected and known lead service lines. This funding, if acquired, will assist cities in replacing affected water service lines from the water main to the house or building inlet.

The Water Service Line Inventory aims to identify and list all lead and affected water service lines in the Angleton water system. Conducting the Service line Inventory is the first requirement in the Lead Service Line replacement process. In addition, the Water Service Line Inventory includes a requirement to list the customer's service line material (from the water meter to the building inlet).

The City of Angleton has started this inventory process by using an **Online Public Survey** that each water customer will need to fill out. Of course, the city will gather the information in several other ways, including records research and visual inspections, but it is costly.

The City of Angleton is asking for the public's help to meet the inventory requirements by each water customer filling out the **Online Public Survey**. The survey is less than 20 questions and will give the city the required information for the Water Service Line Inventory. Only information necessary will be released to the state (address, age of home, service line material, etc.). Each water customer will be mailed a copy of the survey form from the City of Angleton.
